Dear Parents, Pupils & Governors,

Happy New Year and welcome to the new term. I hope you all have had an enjoyable Christmas holiday.

<u>New Topic</u> – All the children in KS2 have started their new topic on Volcanoes and Earthquakes this week. Pupils in Year 3 and 4 will be producing a news broadcast in the style of 'Newsround' on Natural Disasters. Look out for more updates on the topic later this term.

These should be carried out at least once every two years, even if there are no problems with their eyesight. These tests can be done at a high street opticians and are free for all children under 16 years old (and those under 19 years old in full-time education). You can speak to your child's optician if you have any concerns about your their vision.
