Space Day - The Reception children dressed up and enjoyed a day of space activities. Pupils made clay aliens, made and ate 'moon snacks', and enjoyed using crates and tyres to build rockets and moon buggies to use for their role play. The children also had the opportunity to make pictures of astronauts and create their own planets using chalks, tissue paper and experimenting with mixing paint and foam. The children continued their learning after space day by investigating how to launch mini paper rockets and creating Space Stations in their classrooms.

<u>Coventry Cathedral Trip</u> — To support their Second World War topic children in Year 5 and 6 visited the original Coventry Cathedral and the new Cathedral that joins it. They were shown a 1940s classroom and kitchen and learnt about what life would have been like during this period. The children talked about air raid shelters and had to think about what children would have taken with them if they were evacuated in 1940 and in 2023 - the objects would have been very different!
