The children enjoyed going on a bear hunt on the field before sitting down with their bears and their special guest, Mrs Crothall, to enjoy their picnic

<u>Year 6 Pantomime</u> – The Year 6 children entertained their parents and the children this week in a hilarious performance of 'Cinderella' by Roald Dahl. <u>Live Sound Experience</u> – Several of our musicians took part in a live sound experience day with Mr Badham from Alcester Academy. They were joined by two 'technicians' and everyone saw how every member of the team has an important part to play in a performance. <u>Water Safety</u> – At their recent meeting, Governors raised the issue of water safety in the river and the balancing ponds in the newer estates around the village. Children should be aware of the following key points:

- The shock of cold water and uneven banks and river beds can make swimming difficult and increase the difficulty in getting out of the water
- Lack of safety equipment increases the difficulty for rescue
- The depth of the water can change and be unpredictable
- Underwater objects and hazards may not be visible
- Strong currents can rapidly sweep people away
- Water quality can be dangerous
