<u>5 4 3 2 1 Blast Off</u>! – The Reception children really enjoyed their Space Day on Wednesday – thanks to parents for your support in dressing your child in some amazing space themed outfits. Pupils took part in a number of activities including making icing to decorate biscuits as planets, creating clay aliens and model spaceships. They made and launched paper rockets and had a great time role-playing inside the classroom space station.

<u>Tudor Topic</u> – Children in Mrs Satchwell's and Mrs Mills' class have been looking at using Tudor style language in their letter writing. They have written letters to the Lord featuring in our class book 'Treason' (see below) as well as a letter to the Pope from Henry VIII asking for a divorce from Catherine of Aragon so he could marry Anne Boleyn. Mrs Satchwell's class have also been researching Henry VIII to see how he changed over time - his appearance, character and his interests, as well as other's opinions of him.

<u>Tree Planting</u> – On Thursday we had 9 trees and 50 whips planted in the area in the front of the school. The project, kindly supported by Bidford Parish Council, aims to improve the look of the school grounds and is inspired by the national initiative of 'Plant a Tree for the Jubilee'.

Covid Arrangements

- As we continue to have cases confirmed across all year groups, we request that parents wear a face
 covering while on the school site and maintain social distancing wherever possible. Our staff will continue
 to wear masks in corridors and communal areas.
- ALL visitors that come into the school building must wear a face covering.

- Increased ventilation in the classrooms during this cold weather may mean you child wishes to wear an additional clothing layer or bring a small blanket to have on their lap.
- If your child is unwell, they should remain at home until they are better. A PCR test should be taken if they are displaying Covid symptoms.
- If your child receives a positive Covid-19 test result outside of school hours, please leave a message on the school answerphone and send a text to 07591 541444 immediately. We will contact you to confirm the next steps. Please do not use this number for any other messages. If your child receives a negative Covid-19 test result, please contact the office on 01789 773201 before sending your child back to school.
- Although there has not been any update to the national definition of Covid-19 symptoms (cough, high temperature, loss/change in taste/smell), please also be mindful of the wider symptoms of Covid-19 – sore throat, headache, fatigue, muscle aches, blocked/runny nose, shortness of breath, diarrhoea and vomiting, and cold-like symptoms. Anyone with COVID-19 symptoms should isolate and book a PCR test.
- If your child displays symptoms of Covid in school, we will take their temperature and test their sense of smell before phoning you to come and collect them if we feel it is necessary.
