Dear Parents, Pupils & Governors,

<u>Science</u> – We hosted an Odgen Trust 'Light Day' in school this week and children from our school along with children from three other local schools took part. They participated in a number of activities including sorting light sources, investigating reflective surfaces, writing mirror images to each other and negotiating a mirror maze. Children also created shadow figures out of foil and made their own kaleidoscope,

<u>Cotswold Wildlife Park</u> – Children in Year 1 and 2 visited the Cotswold Wildlife Park on Wednesday to conclude their topic on Kenya from earlier in the year. During the day, they were able to see many animals including giraffes, camels, meerkats, penguins, leopards, and otters. They all enjoyed a picnic lunch and had a great day. <u>Sports Day</u> — Our annual Sports Day returned this year and our pupils competed in a variety of events including long jump, sprint, hurdles, howler throw and egg & spoon. Well done to everyone but congratulations to our winning house Jupiter! Mrs Stockley won the KS1 staff race and much to Miss Drissell's disappointment, Mrs Jewell won the KS2 staff race! Great fun was had in the parents' race too - very competitive and not without a bit of cheating! — thank you to everyone for taking part and for supporting the event, it was lovely to enjoy such a 'normal' school activity again!

<u>Porridge!</u> - The Reception children have based some of their learning around the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. They tasted coco pops, porridge and toast investigating why coco pops turned the milk brown, why porridge can be chewy and saw how bread changes when it is toasted. The children discussed the importance of starting each day with a healthy breakfast.

<u>Gardening</u> - The peas that the reception children have been growing have now been harvested. The children enjoyed opening the pea pods and discovering the peas inside. The children are now waiting for the tomatoes, carrots, beans and potatoes to be ready.
