**School Meals** – The price of a school meal in September will increase to  $\underline{£2.40}$  per day for children in KS2. Families of children entitled to income dependent free school meals should register so that we can claim <u>Pupil</u> <u>Premium of up to £1385</u> per child to help support your child's learning. Please go to <u>www.warwickshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals</u> to apply or contact us in confidence for further information. The school menu has been sent home with your child.
