<u>Reception -</u> have been talking about our families and how special they are. We have enjoyed looking at our family photos and talking about our family members. We have drawn pictures of our families too. We have started to practise sounds to help us with our reading and writing. Please look inside book bags for home learning journeys.

KS1 (Y1,Y1/2 & Y2) – have started to read Billy Goats Gruff as our traditional tale unit in English starts. The children have enjoyed exploring many different traditional tales and playing games of guess the characters and
