<u>Reception –</u> have created some poppy pictures to support their learning about Remembrance Day. They have also been exploring further the roles of people who help us in the local community. We have enjoyed sharing the story of Supertato and we are excited to find out more about the adventures of Evil Pea!

<u>KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2)</u> — The children have started to learn the nativity songs ready for their performance in December 'Lights, Camel, Action!'. In addition, we really appreciate all of the parents support in supporting the children with their homework this first week. It has been greatly received and praised. The children have also taken part in an assembly about anti-bullying week and have been exploring how we can keep everyone safe at school.

LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4) – have had another brilliant week of learning. They absolutely loved taking part in the TTRS England Rocks battle and rocking out! Year 4 (Hare class) have written their diary entries about escaping Pompeii and there were some outstanding pieces of writing! In Year 3/4 (Fox Class), they have started to explore the features of writing instructions in preparation for writing their own next week.

On Monday, LKS2 spent some time discussing the importance of Remembrance and how the brave soldiers helped our lives and the world we live in today. Year 3 and 4s history has seen us exploring Roman legacies and the impact they had on Britain, we were very surprised at some of the things they left behind, like carrots and cats!

<u>UKS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6)</u> — On Thursday, all the Year 5 children had another visit from Nick Priest, who is running the local TWIN project. His project is aiming to develop a sense of community between Bidford-on-Avon and our twin town Ebsdorfergrund, Germany. The children explored and compared lots of photos of our village and Ebsdorfergrund, which had been taken by some of our students over the summer holidays. The children also created a final piece around 'What Bidford Means to Me'. They had the opportunity to get creative using oil pastels, paints, coloured pencils and cutting and sticking coloured paper. Excitingly, their final pieces will be sent to the students in Ebsdorfergrund along with a letter introducing themselves to their pen-pals.

Food Bank

Following on from a previous newsletter, as well as supporting Stratford Foodbank with the reverse advent calendar we would also like to support their book appeal.

At the start of November Stratford-upon-Avon Foodbank launched its Christmas campaign and this year they are doing something slightly different. Since April they have been asking for donations of used but good condition children's books for children coming to our sessions to take home with them. They want to continue offering the magic of books to families in Stratford-upon-Avon and the surrounding area this Christmas. They want to gift a book token to each child whose family receives a Christmas hamper. Last year their Christmas hampers benefited 600 children. They need to raise £3000 from this campaign to enable them to give each child a £5 book token.

"We want to focus on this campaign because of the increasing poverty gap, worsened by the recent cost of-living crisis. This means increasingly children are growing up without adequate access to books. The impact of this is enormous and lasts a lifetime. Children who are given the time and resources to become readers benefit from greater opportunities, a better grasp on language, improved self-esteem and empathy as well as increased attainment.

Books are more than a gift under the tree – they bring families together, spark joy and provide comfort in times of stress. Support us in bringing joy this Christmas by gifting a monetary donation to our campaign and help us put a Christmas present under the tree for each child in receipt of a Christmas hamper from Stratford-upon-Avon Foodbank."

<u>Timestable Rock Stars Competition</u>




