

**Reception** – have been learning about the features of different types of minibeasts such as worms, snails, spiders, beetles, bees etc. They have been comparing similarities and differences between them, such as naming minibeasts that have wings, no legs etc. The children have been writing facts about mini beasts to share with their friends. They have enjoyed searching for minibeasts in the outdoor area and finding out about their habitats. In maths we have been learning about sharing.




KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2) – have been making fruit kebabs in our design and technology lessons this week. We began by researching where different fruits came from and even tasted a variety of different fruits before finally making our own fruit skewers. The children learnt lots of new vocabulary and really enjoyed eating their kebabs. In addition, the children have finished performing writing and learning poems of by heart and have really enjoyed exploring these topics.



**LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4)** – have had a wonderful week learning even more about dragons! They have written their own kennings, which are an Anglo-Saxon poem which includ two words on each line. The words are nouns and verbs, giving off the impression of a riddle like poem. Later in the week, we looked at non-chronological reports as the children move into writing their own reports about a dragon. Topic learning has turned to the Battle of Hastings, and it was really interesting to see how the battle was won and how this piece of history had such a huge impact on our lives today.

KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6) – On Monday, Year 5, 5/6, and Year 6 took part in a fantastic enrichment day, enjoying three exciting activities. They explored science by making parachutes, tried their hand at a new sport of pickleball, and took part in a money and finance workshop – Goal for Life. It was wonderful to see the children engaged in such a variety of experiences! In the classroom, Year 6 have now completed their biographies on Hitler, while Year 5 have finished writing letters to their German pen pals, which are now ready to be sent.



#### Stratford Food Bank
