<u>Reception</u> – had a great start to their week with participating in science and dance workshops as part of their enrichment day activities. In their science workshop they explored floating and sinking. They designed their own model boats and tested them in water. We have continued our learning about minibeasts including exploring their habitats and identifying which mini beasts are insects. We have enjoyed participating in whole school Easter activities and making cards for our family.

<u>KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2)</u> – have spent time learning about Easter and how other festivals are important to many different religions. We have taken a focus on a Jewish worldview, exploring festivals like Chanukah and Pesach, comparing these to our own spring and Christmas festivals. In addition, the children have learnt about what makes the candles so special for many different religions around the world.

We are particularly proud of how safely our KS1 children walked down to our church service and set a really good example joining in with all of the lovely songs we sang.

<u>LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4)</u> – have had an amazing last week of term. They absolutely loved the visit from the chicks and their Easter hunt with the Year 2 children. They all produced some fantastic special writing about the Easter story. Our visit to the church was super fun and we loved singing our Easter songs. Thank you to all of the families for their support this term with the children's learning. Have a wonderful Easter break.

KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6) – On Tuesday, UKS2 pupils were transported back in time to the 1940s for an immersive experience of life as a World War II evacuee. The day began with wartime songs on a journey aboard a steam train to Cheltenham, where the children did an excellent job of spotting an undercover German spy! The pupils then explored a collection of 1940s artefacts, including toys, kitchen items and clothing from the era before learning how to tackle a fire using a traditional pump and hosepipe—just as people would have during the Blitz. The children also experienced the chilling sound of an air raid siren and took shelter in an authentic air raid shelter!

Thank you to all the families that make an active journey to school over the last fortnight. We have been lucky to have the weather to make it a more enjoyable experience.


As a school community we made 791 active journeys, an increase of 129 from last year and we contributed to a country wide total of 273,5433 journeys.

**Book of the Week** – Mrs Horsburgh & Mrs Bond's class have been reading 'Tom Crean's Rabbit' by Meredith Hooper.

It's very cold in Antarctica, and the Terra Nova is crowded with both men and animals. Tom the sailor is looking for a quiet and cozy place for his pet rabbit to have her babies. From high in the rigging to down in the hold, the crewman takes readers all through the ship while he searches for a spot where his rabbit can make her nest. Based on the



diaries of men who sailed to the South Pole on board the Terra Nova in 1910 with Captain Robert Falcon Scott, Tom Crean's Rabbit introduces the historic voyage to young readers. Kitchen's stunning illustrations capture the magnificence of the Antarctic landscape and notes in the back of the book provide more information about the expedition and detail the adventures of the book's hero.

It has been such a busy term with so much happening. As I look back it is hard to believe we only have one term left of this academic year. I am so impressed with how our children have developed over this year and am so impressed with how the children in our Reception classes have grown in confidence.


