<u>Reception</u> – have been reading the story of *Goldilocks and The Three Bears* and discussing its characters, setting, and key events. We also talked about the importance of eating breakfast every day and we began exploring how some breakfast cereals change when milk is added. Additionally, we have been writing special invitations to send home to our teddy bears, inviting them to a teddy bears' picnic at school on Tuesday, 8th July.



KS1 (Y1, Y1/2 & Y2) – have confidently begun their summer term assessments. They have done exceptionally well, working both in small groups and with the whole class to complete these tasks. In addition, the children have had the opportunity to write in their special writing books. We have been planning and writing our own versions of 'The Day the Crayons Quit', featuring a sharpener who is fed up with being dropped in the bin. Take a look at the wonderful example from Year 2!



LKS2 (Y3, Y3/4 & Y4) – have been continuing their work with 'The Butterfly Lion' and using expanded noun phrases and figurative languages to describe the lion's experience of two places: The Savannah desert and the circus. In Science, all three classes have been learning to name the parts of a flower: they examined and dissected small flowers, and next, we will explore the functions of each part. In Geography, we have been exploring the destructive features of earthquakes, including ground shaking, tsunamis, landslides, land raising and lowering, and liquefaction. To deepen our understanding, we watched CCTV footage capturing these events: the ground shaking in Nepal (2015), a tsunami in Japan (2011), landslides during the Nepal earthquake (2015), land raising and lowering in Alaska (1964), and liquefaction during an earthquake in Indonesia (2018). The children were very shocked at how quickly the damage happened.

KS2 (Y5, Y5/6 & Y6) — on Monday 23rd June, the Year 5/6 class dedicated a full day to Geography, focusing on our current topic, *Bidford*. We started by creating a set of questions to form a questionnaire, which will be sent home this week to collect information by next Wednesday. Next, we explored the human and physical features of our local area, which led perfectly into the afternoon session. Here, the children learned how to create a field sketch. After a practice run in the classroom, we headed outside into the sunshine—and wind—to draw their own field sketches of the school grounds. Although challenging, the children produced some excellent sketches they can be very proud of.







Year 2 Science Morning

On Tuesday 24th June, a group of Year 2 children went to a 'Mad About Materials' morning at Batchley First School for a chance to explore the Physics curriculum through practical hands-on activities. These activities included wrapping eggs in a variety of materials and dropping them from a good height to see whether they could crack, building sand castles using a range of different sized tubs to see which made the strongest sandcastles and having a go at building structures out of cocktail sticks and sweets. They also designed their very own spinners to create optical illusions and finally children investigated floating and sinking by seeing how many coins or weights they could put into their plasticine boat before it started to sink. Children had a brilliant time - thank you to Mrs Mansbridge for taking them.


