<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Key religious leader: Prophet Muhammed • Aqiqah ceremony (whispering of adhan & cutting of hair) • Eid-ul-Adha • Mosque/masjid as special place for Muslims • Mecca as a special place for Muslims 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Muslims believe in one God (Allah/ Tawid) and follow the example of the Prophet Muhammad • Stories that help to show how Muslims think of God (Allah) and how following God shows them ways to behave e.g. ‘Muhammad and the cat’, ‘The story of the two brothers’, ‘The crying camel’. • Simple ideas about Muslim beliefs about God - links with some of the 99 Names of Allah <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Holy Qur’an – how the Angel Jibril revealed it to Prophet Muhammad on Mount Hira • Islam teaches that humans should be caretakers (stewards/Khalifahs) of the planet • Islamic calligraphy (no drawing of Allah or the Prophet) • Some ways Muslims mark Ramadan and celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr • Details of the mosque/masjid (wudu, calligraphy, prayer mat, prayer beads, minbar, mihrab, muezzin) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Islamic beliefs about god - the story of the Night of Power – the revelation of the Qur’an to Muhammad, and the story of Muhammad’s night journey and ascension. • The rituals of Islamic prayer (salah), including wudhu and use of a prayer mat • Items used for worship (prayer beads, prayer mat, Qur’an and stand, • Key muslim prayer: the First Surah of the Qur’an • Nasheeds and the call to prayer • The significance of fasting 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The meaning and significance of the Five Pillars of Islam as an expression of ibadah (worship and belief in action). Shahadah (belief in one God and his Prophet); salat (daily prayer); sawm (fasting); zakat (alms giving); hajj • The difference between the authority of the Qur’an and other forms of guidance for Muslims: Sunnah (practices, customs and traditions of the Prophet Muhammad); Hadith (sayings and actions of the Prophet Muhammad). • The Shahadah (‘There is no god except Allah’) and use the 99 names of Allah to explore the attributes of God. • The design and purpose of a mosque/masjid and how the architecture and activities reflect Muslim beliefs. • Pilgrimage to Mecca • The importance of being generous and charitable from scripture • Zakat (alms giving) • Examples of Islamic architecture and art
